Dear Reader,

Because the Board changed its fiscal year to align with the Supreme Judicial Court's, this Annual Report covers the ten months ended June 30, 2019. This period was an especially productive one in carrying out the CSB's mission to discharge the collective professional responsibility of the members of the bar regarding thefts of client funds.

The Board made awards of over \$2.3 million during this period, which is significantly higher than our normal level of \$2 million annually. Consistent with our past experience two dishonest lawyers accounted for nearly 90% of the awards. In October we awarded a non-profit institution \$776,500 to reimburse it for the theft of escrow funds by Kirk Griffin and in May we awarded a family partnership \$1,290,000 for the theft of investment funds by Arthur McCabe. Our Deputy General Counsel Adam Lutynski, with assistance from our Legal Specialist Bernice Addonizio, ably represented us in both cases that were complicated and document intensive. To date, the Board has reimbursed Kirk Griffin's former clients about \$890,000 and Arthur McCabe's former clients approximately \$2,700,000, making him the leading cause of awards in the CSB's history. Helping to restore the good name of the bar in these two case was rewarding but no more so than making a \$2,000 award to an undocumented client of an unscrupulous immigration lawyer.

In June the SJC adopted amendments to the rules applicable to the CSB. This project was encouraged and supported by the SJC and was the culmination of several years of effort by past and present Board members and our staff. The amended rules:

- Are in plain English and gender neutral
- Employ standardized language throughout
- Conform to the Board's existing practices
- Reflect the current multijurisdictional nature of law practice
- Modernize investment requirements for the Clients' Security Fund
- Update administrative provisions.

As with other client protection organizations, we face the challenge of making sure that victims of lawyer theft are aware of the CSB without unnecessarily damaging the reputation of the legal profession. In the period our General Counsel Karen O'Toole, working jointly with bar counsel and its attorney and consumer assistance program, increased the Board's outreach activities with presentations at citizens groups, bar associations and victim-witness assistance

offices. A collateral benefit of this activity is introducing the legal community to the rewards of Board service and of representing claimants pro bono before the Board. Outreach will continue to be a priority in fiscal 2020

The period also saw former Chair Ethan Jeffery and former Vice Chair and Treasurer Martin Newhouse complete their terms of service after lasting contributions to the adjudication of claims as well as to the governance and financial structure of the Board. In another transition, General Counsel Karen O'Toole in June announced her plan to retire at year end after 30 years of service to the Board. We are conducting a search for her successor and in the coming year will celebrate in proper fashion Karen's extraordinary contributions to the Board. The Board continues its oversight of the outside investment manager of the Clients' Security Fund. And as a matter of good practice the Board has rotated its independent accounting firm.

The Board continues to be a national leader in the field of client protection and is proud to serve with the Board of Bar Overseers (licensing and discipline) and Lawyers Concerned for Lawyers (lawyer assistance) as one of the three agencies implementing the SJC's program of lawyer self-regulation.

I would like to thank the Court for the opportunity to serve as Chair and its support of our activities. I would also like to express my appreciation to my fellow Board members for their contributions and collegiality and to our exceptional staff for their hard work, good humor and unfailing dedication to our mission.






